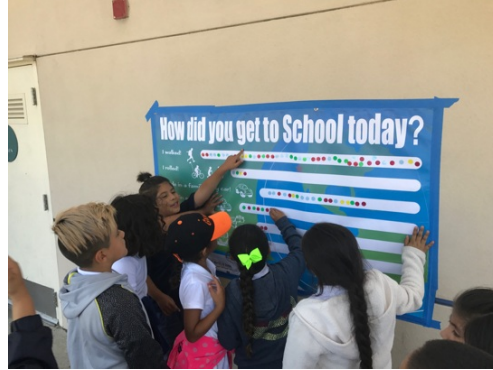
attend college. At the event, Dream Club students will perform theater pieces about their immigration stories, share visual art, and facilitate dialogue among event participants.

### Redwood City School District Students Walk, Bike, Roll, and Take Transit to Participate in International Walk to School Day

On October 4, 2017, students, families, and teachers across the Redwood City School District walked, biked, rolled, or took transit to

participate in this year's International Walk to School Day, supported by Redwood City 2020's Safe Routes to School program. International Walk to School Day is an annual event that promotes health and wellness by encouraging and celebrating families and students who walk to school or take a mode besides a private car. Eleven schools actively participated in this year's event, at which families or school staff organized walking groups, handed out incentives such as stickers and pencils, had students fill out "mode chart" banners, or took classroom tallies.



This year, schools reported 1,413 students getting to school either by foot, bike, scooter, skateboard, or bus. Some classrooms showed participation rates as high as 85%. This event is meant to launch schools into Safe Routes to School programming for the year, which includes walking school buses, bicycle and pedestrian education, and action oriented discussions on enhancing the safety of students and families near schools.
